Attached is the ordinance canvassing the results of the Tuesday, November 6, 2007 Bond election. 3,915 people cast ballots during the election for a 6.43% voter turnout. All propositions were approved. The precinct returns will be available at the meeting.

ORDINANCE NO. 2892

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE BOND ELECTION HELD NOVEMBER 6, 2007.

WHEREAS, notice of said election was actually given by the City as required by law; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on November 6, 2007, in conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas, and the results of said election have been certified and returned by the proper judges and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has considered the returns of said election held November 6, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the election returns, duly and legally made, showed that there were <u>3,915</u> votes cast at the election and that each proposition in the election received the following votes:

Bond Proposition 1 Yes 3,427 (88%) No 480 (12%)

The Issuance of \$27,550,000 general obligation bonds for street improvements

Bond Proposition 2 Yes 3,380 (87%) No 512 (13%)

The issuance of \$9,200,000 general obligation bonds for drainage improvements

Bond Proposition 3 Yes 3,444 (88%) No 467 (12%)

The issuance of \$3,950,000 general obligation bonds for public safety facilities

Bond Proposition 4 Yes 3,007 (77%) No 887(23%)

The issuance of \$6,350,000 general obligation bonds for park improvements

Bond Proposition 5 Yes 2,831 (73%) No 1,048 (27%)

The issuance of \$3,400,000 general obligation bonds for a new animal shelter facility

Bond Proposition 6 Yes 2,753 (71%) No 1,101 (29%)

The issuance of \$2,050,000 general obligation bonds for improvements to the Central Service Center

Bond Proposition 7 Yes 2,641 (68%) No 1,223 (32%)

The issuance of \$2,000,000 general obligation bonds for Economic Development

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1

That it is determined the results of the November 6, 2007 Bond Election as canvassed and tabulated reflect the expressed desires of the qualified voters of the City.
